From the Board

Sometimes a routine phone call can unexpectedly change your life without you even knowing it. Twenty-eight years ago, my husband Bill and I were looking for a nursery school for our newborn daughter. I made a few calls, left a few messages, and the first place that called me back was Temple Judea.

After touring the beautiful playground, meeting Margie and learning about the outstanding program, we enrolled. While I liked being in a Jewish environment, the fact that it was part of a synagogue didn't mean much. My parents had never enjoyed being part of a temple, often felt put off by the lack of friendliness and quit a Conservative temple after a few years. While synagogue life was not part of our family narrative, my parents sent me to Jewish camps every year, celebrated all the Jewish holidays and reinforced how important it was to be committed to the Jewish people.

Those years in the ECC were a revelation. One important thing I learned was that Temple Judea made being Jewish fun. Really fun. My husband, who did not convert until 15 years later, felt very welcome here and that was important. Little by little, we began incorporating more of Temple Judea -- and Judaism -- into our family routine. We celebrated Shabbat, built a sukkah, and joined a Havurah. We realized that practicing Judaism was not only enjoyable, but it brought something deeper and fulfilling to our lives.

One day, I received a phone call from another ECC mom who said she was Vice President of Membership at the temple. I had no idea what that meant, but when she asked me to join her committee, I said, "Sure." And that's the phone call that set me on a course to becoming a lay leader at Temple Judea and changing my life. That nursery school mom's name? Ellen Franklin.

Now, after having served on the board for almost 18 years, I am beginning my term as president, with gratitude for your trust in me. Thank you to our clergy, our sacred partners, to the lay leaders who came before us, and the dedicated staff we work with. Thank you to my amazing predecessor, Ellen Israel, who has set the bar so unbelievably high with her calm wisdom and leadership.

At ECC graduation 25 years ago, Rabbi Raff told all of us parents that Judaism is a team sport. That never left me. I encourage you to call a friend -- even if they are not a member -- and make plans to come to Temple Judea. In addition to our wonderful Shabbat services, we have many meaningful activities for you to participate in: social justice, adult learning. We also have events that are geared to fun and friendship: tequila tastings, summer concerts. We will even take you on trips to Israel or Poland. I challenge you to step out of your comfort zone and invite a friend to join you in experiencing something new at Temple Judea. You see, it's not necessarily the sermon that makes a community holy. Sometimes it is just a phone call.

The Midnight Ride... To Character

I have a friend who no longer listens to the news while driving, because it makes her so angry, and she finds herself clutching the wheel and hating the other drivers on the road. What a world we live in, one in which people feel the anger and violence in themselves, and have to struggle to keep away from the narratives being told in order to simply function.

As a child, I remember being told stories by my parents and grandparents about war, and I remember thinking how safe I was, because they had fought to make it so. Seeing pictures of my grandfather, uncle, and father in uniform, defending their country with honor, still makes my heart burst with pride and humility, that the people who came directly before me had sacred tasks of courage entrusted to them. The courage they exhibited was not one small moment, but a daily putting one foot in front of the other, believing in the cause of this great nation and doing their part to protect it for future generations.

This summer, just before the 4th of July, I had the chance to walk through the newly renovated Paul Revere's house. On the wall of course was the famous Wordsworth poem, one I memorized when I was in the 5th grade:

"Listen, my children, and you shall hear of the midnight ride of Paul Revere.."

"The fate of a nation was riding that night..."

The fate of a nation... the fate of a nation was in the hands of regular folks, this one a silver and goldsmith, who recognized the need to courageously stand for freedom and take part in the building of a new place where this sacred idea would thrive. What an inspiring thought, that this regular man, a father, a husband, a man with a regular job and a regular life, could do this and other significant things that contributed to our history.

**"A cry of defiance, and not of fear, a voice in the darkness,
a knock at the door, and a word that shall echo forevermore!
For, borne on the night-wind of the Past, through all our history, to the last,
in the hour of darkness and peril and need, the people will waken and listen to hear
the hurrying hoof-beats of that steed, and the midnight message of Paul Revere."**

How many people now know this poem? How many people remember the stories of courage and sacrifice from our past? We spend our time looking around at the stories of anguish and pain, victimization and ugliness of our world. We are forced to do so because the news tells no other story. In the Jewish world, we tell stories of the pain of others to elicit sympathy, to gear our hearts and minds toward reaching out to help the homeless and hungry. We use the idea that we were once slaves, that we have been through a long suffering history, to teach that people are victims. Those poor suffering ones... now that we are no longer suffering, we have to help them.

And yes we do. We do have to help. But they are not victims, and neither are we. We have created this myth to counter the self-centeredness that has grown deeper in the souls of each subsequent generation, certainly including my own. But it is not the right way.

There is another way. It is through the stories of ordinary people who did great things, like the silversmith whose courageous actions helped to create this great nation; it is through the focus on character traits like self-sacrifice, humility, patience, equanimity and courage. It is through focusing on ourselves, not in the self-centered way of fulfillment of needs, but in the self-aware way of the soul searcher. If we fill ourselves with stories of greatness done by ordinary people, we too will have the capacity to be great.

The stories of character are found all over our past, in the Torah, in American history, in the history of our ancestors who came to this country in search of a life unencumbered by tyranny and evil. None of these ancestors of ours are perfect. All of them have deep flaws. But we cannot toss out their great deeds because of their not so great ones. We so desperately need heroes of character to emulate, we so desperately need to tell our world the good stories rather than the bad. As we approach the Holy Days, I pray that we turn our minds and hearts to the growth of our own personal character. We can combat the anguish of this world one soul at a time, starting with our own.

How We Spend Our Summer Vacation

One of the most often asked questions we hear as the school year is winding down is: what do you do all summer? After all, school is not in session. It appears a logical question since there aren't classes during summer. But the reality is that we do A LOT! Summer is incredibly busy for us. We develop new curriculum, hire teachers and other staff, order supplies, refresh classrooms and more. We process registration forms and assign students to classes. We meet with the families of prospective students and with parents of continuing students. However, every year it seems that our number one activity is to make phone calls.

Why do we make so many phone calls? Because everything else we do depends on you enrolling your child. So, we spend most of July and August calling families to encourage them to submit their online enrollment forms as early as possible. We do not know how many teachers we need for a particular grade, on a particular day, until you enroll your child. We do not know how many classes we need, how many art supplies, or how many textbooks. We cannot make class lists, prepare schedules or letters or just about anything else we need to do, until you enroll your children for class. So, unfortunately, we spend most of our summer trying to get parents to re-enroll their children – something they intend to do anyway.

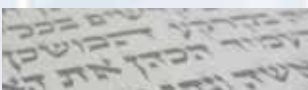

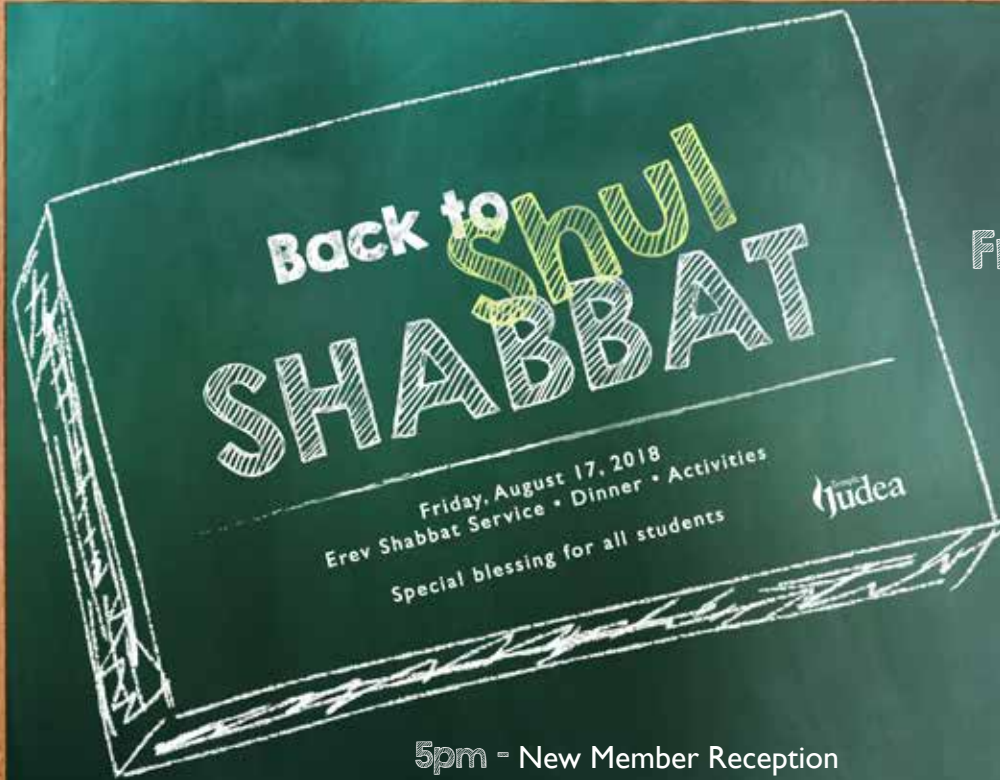

Rabbi Cantor Alison Wissot is one of a small number of clergy who are both rabbis and cantors, and Ellen Franklin began her career as the only woman on her team of network television executives.

This year-long celebration, in recognition, acknowledgment, respect and joy, for of all that women do to shape the Jewish landscape will kick-off on Sunday, September 23 at our annual Pillars Event. Our keynote speaker will be our own Craig Erwich, Hulu Senior Vice President of Content, who greenlit and shepherded the development of the 8-time Emmy Award winning Hulu series, *The Handmaid's Tale*, based on the feminist dystopian novel by Margaret Atwood.

Our celebratory year will culminate with our Gala on Saturday, May 11, 2019, Erev Mother's Day, as we honor Rabbi Cantor Alison Wissot and Executive Director Ellen Franklin. Many more details to follow.

The Pop Up Choir will meet once a month right after Religious School on Sunday mornings with Cantor Kliger. We'll learn joyous songs and prayers that will be performed during services throughout the year. While it's easiest to participate if you are enrolled in Sunday Religious School, those who come to Tuesday Religious School are certainly welcome to join us on Sundays for Pop Up Choir. (*Some kindergarten students may require at least one parent to remain present during the rehearsal).

Packing Backpacks at Camp

Campers packed new backpacks with notebooks, pencils and pens, markers, calculators, and other supplies as they made their way through an assembly line staffed by Social Action committee members. These 500 full backpacks will make their way to the students who need them through School on Wheels, an organization devoted to providing tutoring and supplies to school-age children in Southern California experiencing homelessness. The School on Wheels program enables students to be prepared and ready to learn, and to feel just like every other student on the first day of school.

Campers first got to hear about the organization, and about students just like them who are excited to begin a new school year

with new backpacks and fresh pencils. Once they understood the impact of their participation, the packing began! Competition was fierce among the older campers to see who could stuff the most backpacks at once by wearing them front and back and hanging them off of their arms. Campers were rewarded for their hard work by a sweet treat and the knowledge that they had done a good deed for another child.

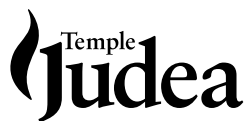
